Overview and context

The priority for Aldworth School is to continue to provide face-to-face, high-quality education within an environment which is as 'normal' as possible, enabling flexibility in curriculum delivery and the most effective teaching and learning. The School will continue to have a Covid Risk Assessment in place, including controls such as good hygiene, cleaning regimes, ventilation and testing arrangements. There will also be a contingency plan to support the management of a Covid outbreak. In the event that positive cases at Aldworth meet the relevant threshold as set out within the government guidance, the School will continue to contact both UKHSA, in line with the guidance, and the School Improvement Manager. Primarily, this is to ensure the help, advice and support needed to deal with the issues but also to enable us to inform key people within the local authority and community, as appropriate.

The School will ensure that students, parents and carers are helped to understand the latest Covid-19 guidance and what it means for pupils at Aldworth.

This includes:

- The importance of continuing control measures such as hand washing and circumstances when face coverings will be required, for example when using designated transport
- Households to continue regular rapid flow testing twice each week or daily testing if advised by NHS Test and Trace
- What to do if a child tests positive for COVID-19
- to keep children/young people at home if they are feeling unwell. Even if they don't have COVID-19 symptoms or their COVID-19 test is negative, they may still have an illness which could be passed on to other people
- Supporting children and young people's mental health and wellbeing.

Prevention and levels of control – an overview is given below of the steps along with relevant descriptors for the schools response to a 'low', 'medium' and 'high' scenario of Covid occurrence. At this end of this document a more detailed Covid Outbreak Management plan is included to detail the actions if the school moves to 'High risk'. The School will, in all circumstances, follow national and local guidance, including engagement with NHS track and trace. As further advice emerges from UKHSA the Senior Leadership team may decide to implement aspects from the medium / high scenarios without fully changing the risk category.

Low Risk

Whilst Covid is still prevalent in society, locally or nationally. **Occasional cases in school. Limited in school transmission,** the school will as a matter of routine maintain these routines:

- Room ventilation
- Sanitising equipment available in all rooms
- Hygiene reminders
- Enhanced day cleaning
- Virtual parents' events
- Covid risk assessment in place
- Seating plans
- Students kept off for any illness / national guidelines followed for isolation and testing
- Virtual school running for isolating students
- Face masks on school bus

Medium Risk

Numerous cases over more than 2 year groups. **Evidence of more than 2 cases of in-school transmission. High local rates of Covid.** The School will maintain the low risk routines and in addition:

- Masks in corridors
- Teachers socially distance from students in lessons
- Defined eating areas
- Enrichment limited to single year groups
- Parents asked to report LFT results to school
- On site LFT for students before major events
- Review and risk assessment of large-scale events
- Covid risk assessment reviewed
- Limit assemblies
- Review changing for PE
- Online meetings where appropriate (e.g. staff briefing)

High Risk

Public Health England **outbreak status.** The School will maintain the low and medium risk routines and in addition:

- Compulsory masks in lessons
- Zones re-established
- Enrichment cancelled
- Students in bubbles
- Staggered start/end of day
- Covid risk assessment reviewed
- Routine cleaning of shared equipment

Control measures for employees

Any child with COVID-19 symptoms will be collected and isolated by the SSO. The child's parents/carers will be instructed to collect their child immediately and keep them at home until they have been PCR tested for COVID-19

A member of staff must first wear gloves, an apron, a face mask and a visor and then escort the child with COVID-19 symptoms to be isolated

Before putting on the PPE, staff must perform hand hygiene. Use alcohol hand rub or gel or soap and water. Make sure

		you are hydrated and are not wearing any jewellery, bracelets, watches or stoned rings. Masks, gloves and aprons should be changed after tending to each pupil and should be regarded as contaminated after a single use and must be removed and be disposed of safely.

Additional Infection Control, Cleaning and Hygiene Measures applied

- All electric hand dryers to remain temporarily disconnected and those toilets to have a supply of paper towels and bins instead.
- Drinking fountains flushed through in compliance with certified COVID-19 regulations and are now fully operational. They are serviced and sanitised (in line with quidance) every 6 months.
- Each classroom has been provided with an allocation of essential PPE and antibacterial wipes and it is the responsibility of class-based staff to notify KTR / Site staff IN GOOD TIME when any items need to be replenished (via email).

COVID-19: outbreak management plan

This plan is based on the contingency framework for managing local outbreaks of COVID-19 and the schools operational guidance from step 4, published by the Department for Education (DfE).

We will only implement some, or all, of the measures in this plan in response to recommendations provided by our local authority (LA), director of public health (DsPH), UK Health Security Agency (UKHSA) health protection team or the national government.

It may be necessary to implement these measures in the following circumstances:

- > To help manage a COVID-19 outbreak within the school
- > If COVID-19 infection rates in the community are extremely high, and other measures have failed to reduce transmission
- > As part of a package of measures responding to a 'variant of concern' (VoC)

1. Testing

If recommended, we will increase the use of home testing by pupils and staff. If it is advised that we reintroduce an asymptomatic testing site (ATS) at our school, we will consult with the director of public health (DsPH) to discuss any further support we need to do this.

2. Face coverings

If recommended, pupils, staff and visitors who are not exempt from wearing a face covering:

> Will be asked to keep on or put on a face covering when arriving at school and moving around indoors in places where social distancing is difficult to maintain, such as in communal areas

And/or:

> Will be asked to wear a face covering in classrooms or during activities, unless social distancing can be maintained or a face covering would impact on the ability to take part in exercise or strenuous activity

3. Shielding

We will adhere to national guidance on the reintroduction of shielding, which would apply to those on the shielded patient list (SPL).

We will speak to individuals required to shield about additional protective measures in school or arrangements for home working or learning.

4. Other measures

If recommended, we will limit:

- > Residential educational visits
- > Open days
- > Transition or taster days
- > Parents coming into school
- > Live performances

If recommended, we will reintroduce:

- > Bubbles, to reduce mixing between year groups
- > Zones re-established break / lunch / toilets / food service points
- > Staggered start/end of day
- > Routine cleaning of shared equipment

5. Attendance restrictions

Attendance restrictions will only be recommended as a last resort. If recommended, we will implement the measures in this section.

5.1 Eligibility to remain in school

In the first instance, we will stay open for:

- > Vulnerable pupils
- > Children of critical workers
- > Year 10 and 11 pupils
- > Any other pupils due to take external exams this academic year

If further restrictions are recommended, we will stay open for:

- > Vulnerable pupils
- > Children of critical workers

5.2 Education and support for pupils at home

All other pupils will be required to stay at home and will receive remote education.

We will aim to deliver remote education that meets the same quality and quantity of education that pupils would receive in school.

The school will continue to provide meals or lunch parcels for pupils eligible for benefits-related free school meals while they are not attending school because of COVID-19 isolation guidelines.

5.3 Safeguarding

We will review our child protection policy to make sure it reflects the local restrictions and remains effective.

We will aim to have a trained DSL or deputy DSL on site wherever possible.
